Lent Flowers

During lent flowers, even to the Blessed mother are discouraged. Instead let's make a donation to the poor.

Ash Wednesday: -Ash Wednesday is February 14th. Thus if you wish a fancy meal with your loved one, consider doing so on Tuesday, February 13th

Lent Begin on February 14th - Ash Wednesday.

Mass at 9:00 a.m. and 6:30 P.M. Bring last year Palms to church by February 11th.

Rules for fasting

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence. The norms of fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.

If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (on Holy night) as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus, and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily his Resurrection.

Way of the cross will be every Friday at 7 p.m. during Lent beginning on Feb. 16th

Major flu outbreak prompts dioceses to implement prevention protocols

The bishop urged parishioners who are sick to stay away from church gatherings and remind them that they are not obligated to attend weekly Mass when ill. Parishioners also are urged, but not required, to receive Communion in their hand rather than on their tongue. Priests are advised to be careful not to touch the tongues or hands of communicants. Parishioners are advised not to shake hands during the sign of peace and stop the use of consecrated wine during Communion.

Remember when you take Communion, you're taking the body and the blood of Christ, so even if you only receive the host and not the precious blood you're still receiving Communion.
